Livewire is a **free**, **safe** and **fun** online community for people aged over 10 and under 21 living with a serious illness, chronic health condition or disability.

Livewire is an initiative of the Starlight Children's Foundation, developed to provide a safe and supportive online space where young people can hang out, connect, share experiences, creatively express themselves and know that they are not alone.

There are hours of entertainment, chat rooms, forums, games and competitions. Chat hosts and moderators trained in adolescent health are online 7 days a week to ensure that Livewire remains a supportive and fun place. Livewire is working with the Australian Federal Police to make certain all members of Livewire remain safe while engaging with the community.
